



Recommended Books

Suggestion	“I can...”	Date/Details
Encourage your child to listen and identify different sounds in the natural and the built environment.	I can identify sounds in the natural and built environment.	
Talk about the wonder of the natural world when you are out and about with your child.	I can see wonder in the natural world.	
Sing action songs and rhymes with your child e.g. “Itsy bitsy spider...”	I can sing an action song or rhyme.	
Show your child danger signs, such as deep water, electricity and ‘!’ All red triangle signs mean danger.	I can recognise danger signs.	
Read stories to your child suggesting that they make up an ending. What do you think happens next?	I can make up an ending to a story.

Teach your child to recognise and understand the Recycle symbol. 	I can recognise the recycle symbol.	
Teach your child the song 'Old Macdonald had a Farm EE I EE I O'.	I can sing 'Old Macdonald had a farm'.	
Find some 'props', character dolls, toys, etc., and show your child how they can act the story out with them.	I can tell a story using toys.	
Teach A.A. Milne's poem from Winnie the Pooh: <i>Isn't it funny how a bear likes honey? Buzz, buzz, buzz! I wonder why he does?</i>	I can remember a rhyme about animals.	
Teach your child to recognise the and understand the Fairtrade symbol. 	I can recognise the Fairtrade symbol.
